Dear Governor Roemer:

For the right to operate a casino in the city of New Orleans, I will pay to the state of Louisiana a lump sum fee of 100 million dollars within ninety days of granting this right. In addition, an estimated 107 million dollars in other taxes will be generated annually from the casino operation and related tourism.

This proposal is subject to the following general conditions:

- The license is for the exclusive right to operate the only casino in the state of Louisiana. All other forms of casinos and/or gambling devices will remain illegal.
- 2) This exclusive license is for a term of fifteen years.
- 3) The city of New Orleans will grant unto me a reasonable long-term lease on the Rivergate and expedite all permits.
- 4) Any gambling laws and taxation adopted by Louisiana will be similar to those currently in effect for the states of Nevada and New Jersey.

The taxes generated by the casino operation will allow time for a smooth and orderly transition to a more diversified economic and tax structure for the state. The decision to legalize casino gambling rests with you and the State Legislature; however, there is no other means that will produce jobs and tax revenue as quickly.

The impact will stem the flow of Louisiana people seeking employment out of the state. For this reason, I urge you to consider this proposal.

The above projections are made from a study prepared for the Louisiana Office of Tourism by the U. S. Travel Data Center in December 1986. The estimates measure only the direct impact of casino traveler spending. The "multiplier" process, including indirect and induced effects, is not presented.

The economic impact of the casino industry is evidenced by the state of New Jersey which originally projected that 33,700 jobs would be created by casinos. However, a 1987 study by Touche Ross & Company put the actual number of jobs created at 64,300.

This plan would dramatically increase tourism. It would draw from the Southeastern United States, Central and South America. Las Vegas offers 55,000 hotel rooms with a 90% occupancy. New Orleans offers 25,000 hotel rooms with a 60% occupancy.

I, Michael J. McGraw, have been involved in the motel development and management industry for over fifteen years. I currently am President and majority stockholder of the corporations that own and operate the following properties:
